Caught on YouTube

Online video shows Parks Dept. official shaky on Washington Square Park facts

GREENWICH VILLAGE The battle over the city's redesign of Washington Square Park may be heading back to court next month, but the fight broke out again on YouTube this week.

A four-minute documentary also posted on MySpace—detailing the city's plan to redesign the park and the subsequent court battle—shows Parks architect George Velonakis explaining to Community Board 2 "there is a slight reduction" in Washington Square's central plaza. When pressed for specifics, he claims the decrease is "very small ... probably 5 percent."

Yet the city acknowledged the cut would be 23 percent in its response to the lawsuit brought by residents earlier this year to block the project. The locals had claimed the park's gathering space would be cut by 33 percent.

"Their own words are damning," said plaintiff Jonathan Greenberg, who wrote the narration to the

The Washington Square Park project has been controversial because of plans to align the fountain with the famous arch, to reduce gathering space and to put fences around the park. The appellate court picks up the case early next month. **METRO**

video made by Matt David. "You see George Velonakis telling the community board something that was false. But don't take my word—look at what the judge wrote."

In her July 25 ruling, State Supreme Court Judge Emily Jane Goodman found "essential aspects of the Parks Department's plans ... were not adequately revealed to Community Board 2 or the Landmarks Commission." She ordered the Parks Dept. to reapply to both bodies, revealing the plan for Washington Square Park in its entirety.

A Parks Dept. spokesman declined to comment yesterday.
